Hospitalist Track – open to categorical residents seeking to become future leaders in hospital medicine and administration; includes dedicated curricular time, clinical rotations in hospital and palliative medicine, QI and Patient safety projects with individualized mentoring from dedicated hospital faculty.

3. Primary Care and Social Internal Medicine Program – innovative primary care training which prepares trainees to deliver outstanding care to marginalized and underserved populations via comprehensive clinical training in inpatient and ambulatory medicine. 4. Global Health Training - designed as an intense immersion into the clinical, social, economic and political aspects of health in the developing world, this formal curriculum in Global Health is available to PGY-2 residents. Seminars are led by faculty from Montefiore/Einstein as



well as by several world renowned experts in economics, politics and tropical medicine from various non-governmental organizations including Doctors for Global Health and Doctors without Borders. In the PGY-3 year, residents have the opportunity to complete a month-long rotation at a rural hospital in Kisoro, Uganda under the guidance of trained global health faculty.

5. Educational Opportunities – dedicated educational experiences including "Resident-as-Teacher" rotation, weekly journal clubs with faculty facilitators, on-line in-house and proprietary educational modules, evidence-based ambulatory curriculum, comprehensive inpatient core curriculum and an annual board review for PGY-3s.

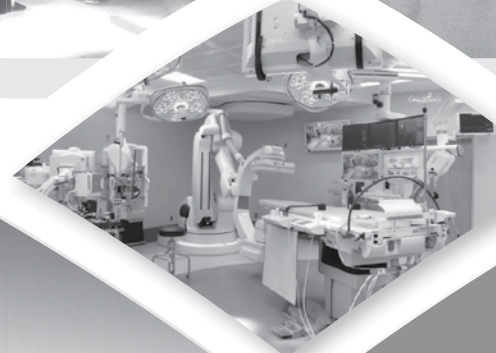

The Department of Vascular Surgery at Allegheny General Hospital

Allegheny General Hospital is proud to be one of the earliest institutions to have the **integrated (0+5) program in vascular surgery**. This relatively new training paradigm allows medical students to enter right out of medical school, and the five-year program will lead to a primary certificate in vascular surgery. The resident will not be eligible for certification in general surgery, but many do not consider this to be a significant deficiency, because most vascular surgeons prefer a vascular-only practice. Our program features a high volume of open and endovascular surgery, numerous clinical research projects, opportunities for internal funding of resident research, a state-of-the-art hybrid operating room, and most importantly, faculty strongly committed to resident education. All of our graduates have successfully passed their board exams and all are well placed in a range of academic and non-academic positions. A distinctive feature of our program is our close connection with our sister program in cardio-thoracic surgery. Trainees in the integrated program will have the option of undertaking a two-year accredited cardiothoracic surgery residency after their vascular surgery residency, making them eligible for certification in both vascular surgery and cardiothoracic surgery. Upon completion, the surgeon will have a broad and unique set of skills encompassing vascular, cardiac and thoracic surgery. Such a trainee would be competitive for a wide variety of career paths, ranging from adult cardiovascular surgery in a university hospital with an emphasis on percutaneous valve and great vessel procedures to conventional heart and vascular surgery in a community hospital.

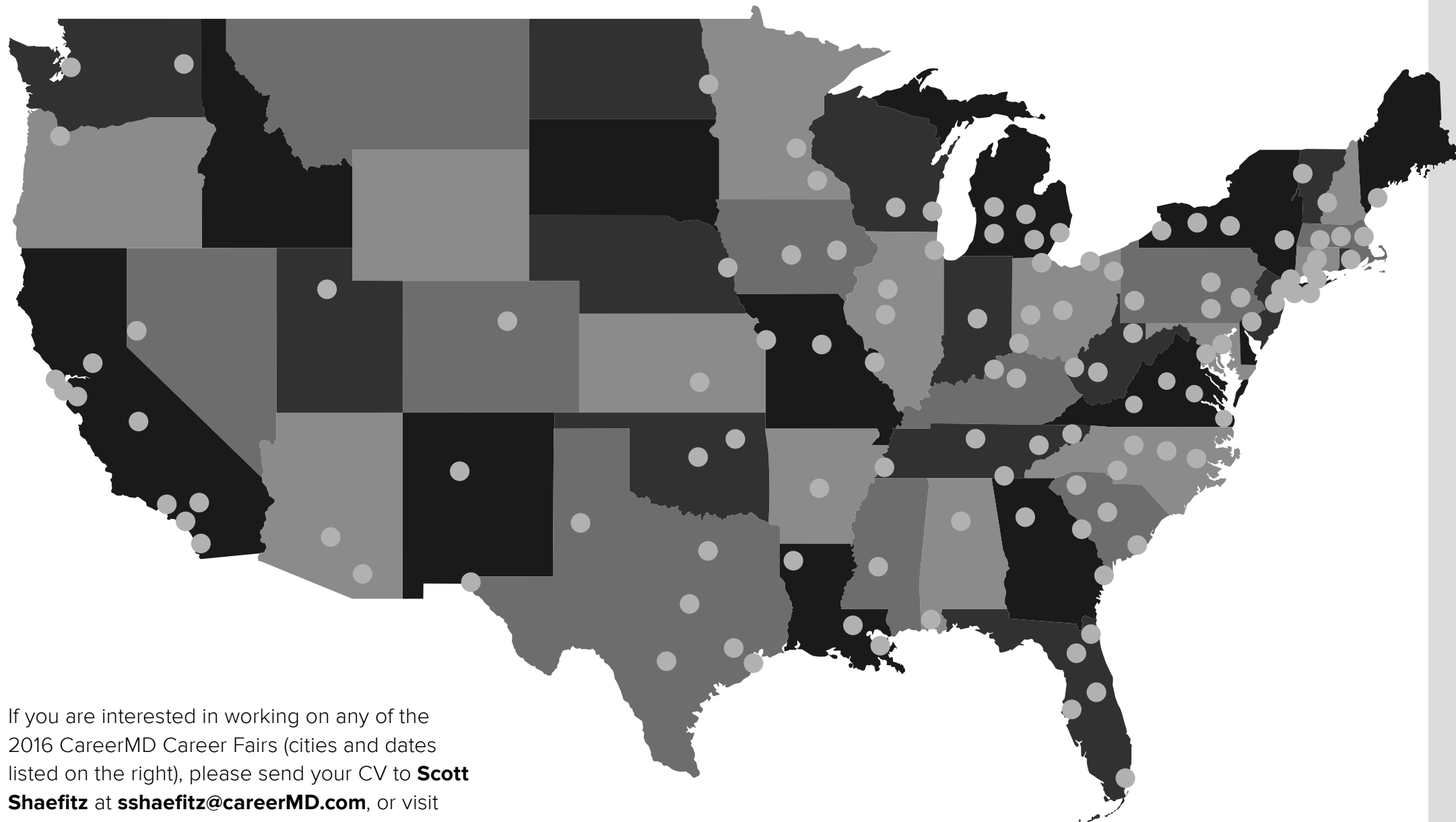

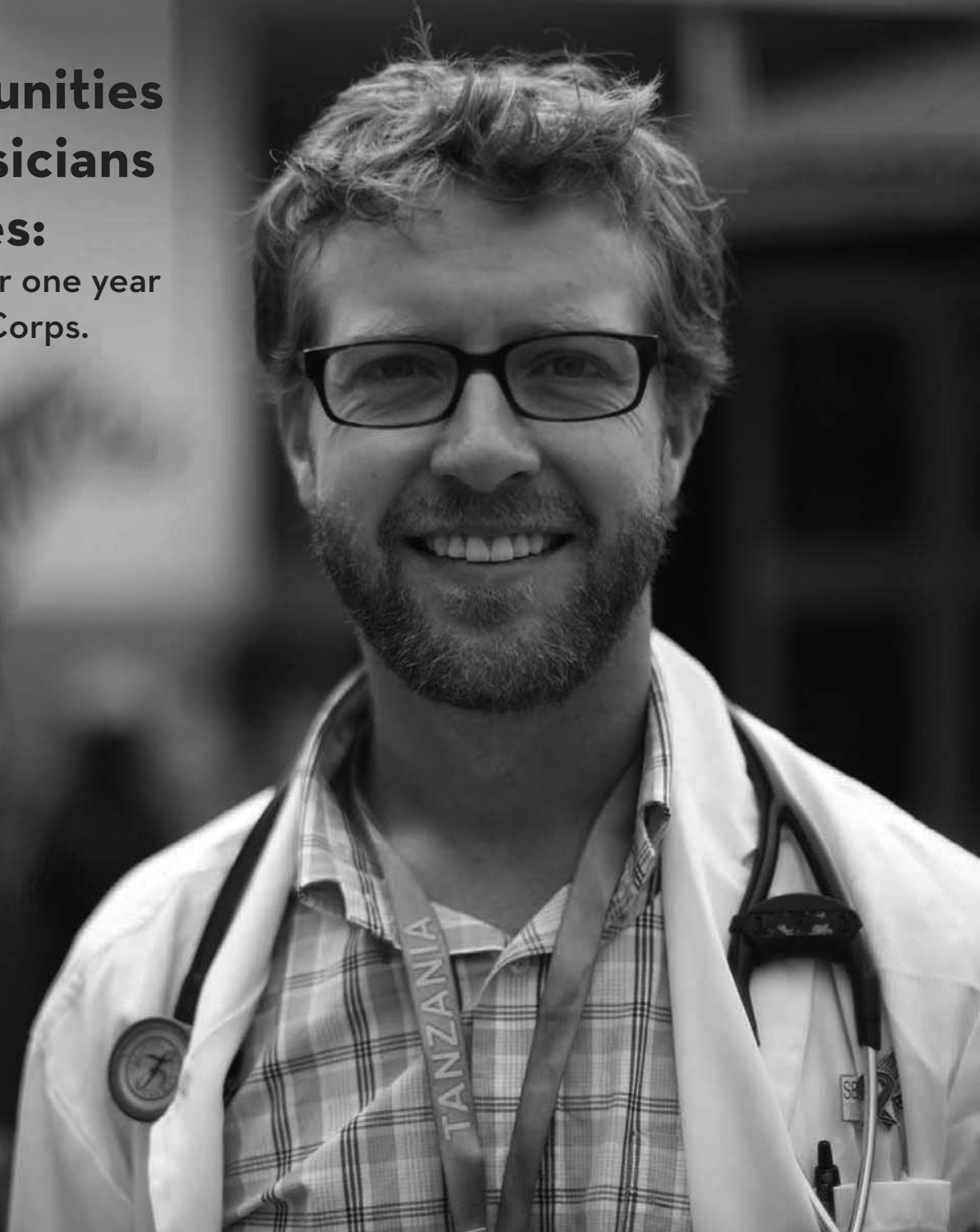
